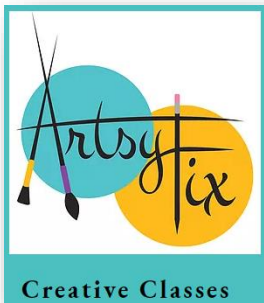
Tending our "Roo Community Garden" every morning, learning to fish at MK Nature Center, learn to tie a knot and the basics of woodworking with our "Learn To with Mr Kody." Attending the summer reading program with our local library & enjoying reading in the parks, next to our garden, or by the lake! Artsy Fix will teach us to sew, make a clock and how to do pottery. The Mk Nature Center will be taking us through an exploration of nature. We will be doing "the stream walk," "nature inspired," "adaptation artistry," "it's a worm world" and much more.

We will be swimming at our local pools. Swimming lessons will be offered if openings become available for daycare groups. We will be creating our own "Art in the Park" including rock painting, making art from items we find in nature, etc.

We will be joining The Traveling Playground to learn new sports and games through Nampa Parks and Rec. We will go rollerskating at the Roller Drome. Some of the other places we'll visit include The Botanical Gardens, Zoo Boise, Capitol building tours, The Boise Aquarium and much more!!

Weekly Tuition: \$162.50 – All snacks and meals, transportation costs, all activity costs. There is a minimum enrollment requirement of 4 weeks.
- Drop-Off by 8:45 am. Daycare available before 8:45 am for \$5/hour.
- Pick-up by 5 pm. Daycare available after 5pm for \$5/hour.

Learn about local animals and all the amazing features they have to survive. Artistically create your own animal with its own set of adaptations to survive in its unique habitat.



Fishing 101

Learn about aquatic habitats and the fishes found in those habitats. Learn how to make the basic knot needed for the beginner angler, the clinch knot. Then learn to cast using a basic push-button reel or make a casting set up with a pop can, fishing line and casting plug. Test those newly gained casting skills to catch plastic fish-super fun! 1st grade-adult. 1.5 hours. \$2.50/student. \$2.50/parent. Teachers free.



It's a Worm's World

Decomposition is happening in the water, on the land; everywhere! Find out how it works in nature and in a human-made compost pile. Meet some compost critters. Learn how the earth recycles itself and what we can do to help recycle nutrients to improve wildlife habitat.

Streamwalk Program-Tour the Nature Center

This is the most popular Nature Center program-- the perfect introduction to HABITAT, ADAPTATIONS, NICHE, FOOD WEBS, and LIFE CYCLES focusing on animals of Idaho. With the use of pelts, skulls, and animal mounts, a wildlife educator gives students an introductory lesson then leads them outside for an educational walk through the Nature Center. Students look underwater and through the forest to learn about wildlife habitat in Idaho.
